Changing topics now...As you may know, the Trump Administration enacted a policy last year that separated over 2,000 children from their families at the U.S.-Mexico border. The Administration described this as a "zero tolerance policy" to prosecute everyone who tried to cross the border illegally. Families at the border were separated by U.S. Customs and Border Patrol, the parents were handed over to law enforcement, and the children were placed in the custody of the Office of Refugee Resettlement, which is run by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

A federal judge later ruled that the administration had to reunite families who were separated, but the administration recently disclosed that thousands of children are still separated. And despite an executive order to stop the policy, it was revealed that the administration is also continuing to separate children from their families.
